

Supplies for Art

-Sketchbook-6"x 9" is recommended, but any size sketch pad will do. Try to get one with at least 50 pages if you can. Michaels or A.C. Moore has a good variety of sketch pads and materials. Spiral bound books work best for sketchbooks.

-A package of #2 pencils

-Donations of basic hand tools, namely, screwdrivers and hammers, would be much appreciated for 3D projects.

-We will be working with many different materials that can be upcycled and repurposed. I am including a list of household items that would benefit our classroom both for projects and daily use:

-Plastic and wooden toys, figurines, plates, silverware, clocks and other small gadgets, and odds and ends, that can be taken apart.

-Aluminum foil, contact paper, wax paper, small yogurt containers, large plain paper plates, small plastic coated paper plates, paper lunch bags, newspapers, cardboard paper rolls, plastic bags and bottles, Cool whip containers with lids, wire, dixie cups.

-Additionally, if you happen to have any of the following (working) items that you are considering donating to Goodwill, I will gladly take them off your hands to use in our classroom:

-Iron, hot plate and/or electric burner, blender, electric hot water kettle
